



Ivo Weinhardt

Ivo Weinhardt was born in 1976 in Heidelberg, Germany. From 1996 to 2002 he studied at the TU Karlsruhe and at the Accademia di Architettura in Mendrisio, graduating as a qualified architect USI AAM/SIA/CAS in Peter Zumthor's diploma class.

Working for Hans-Jörg Ruch in St. Moritz, he realized the "Snow Module Pavilion" in 2003 on the occasion of the World Ski Championships in the Engadine, with which he won first prize in the 2001 competition as a student together with Jan Christoph Herbert. Eternit AG Niederurnen had won. From 2004 to 2006 he was employed at Küchenl Architects in St. Moritz and worked on Norman Foster's "Chesa Futura". He also won the Neubau Cedes AG competition there, as well as the pedestrian bridge in St. Moritz, both of which were awarded 1st prize and were realized.

Ivo Weinhardt joined Fischer Architekten AG in 2006 and has been a member of the management team and co-shareholder since 2014. Until the end of 2016, he headed the construction/execution planning department with Timo Allemann. Between 2012 and 2013, Ivo Weinhardt completed the CAS course for corporate management at ETH Zurich part-time. 2017 Founding of the architectural office hwa Architekten AG in Zurich together with Roland Hinzer.
